Hollywood Producer Jim Miller Takes on British Crime Thrillers in Gritty New Outlaw Biker TV Series

This has always been a world ripe for the screen, dark, visceral, and full of moral complexity."

As streaming platforms and networks continue to seek distinctive, character-driven content with global appeal, the series promises to offer a fresh and authentically British take on the crime genre.

With Miller's track record of transforming bestselling books into international blockbusters, this new series is one of the most anticipated UK television adaptations in development, and proof that the road less travelled is sometimes the most gripping.
